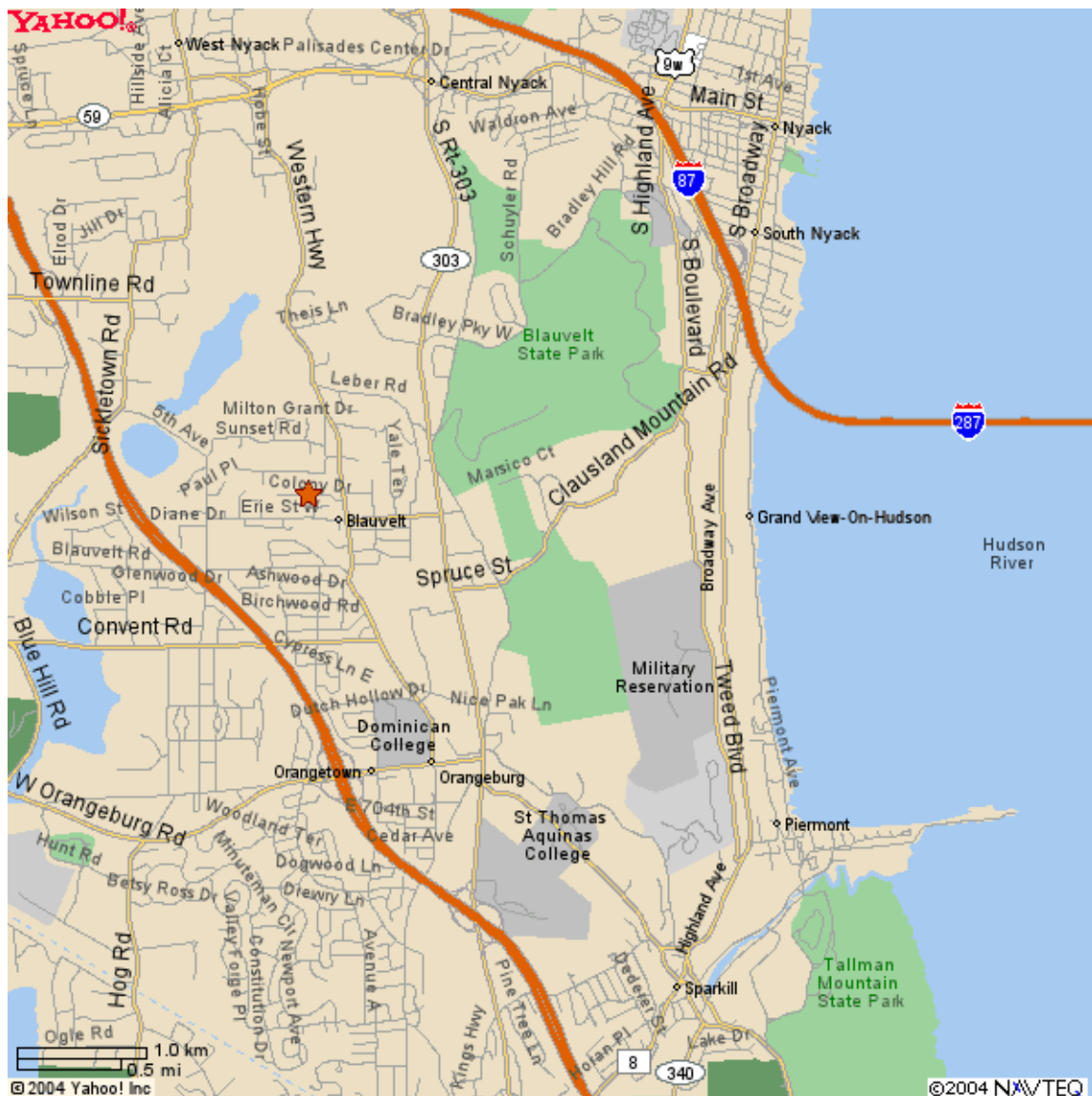


Clausland Cemetery

Mountain Road
Blauvelt, 10913
Rockland County

Greenbush Road Orangeburg

Burial ground used by the first settlers of the northern part of the Tappan Patent, among them the Smith and Blauvelt families. The earliest of 216 recorded graves is 1744 but prior interments were made. There are 14 Revolutionary War soldiers and 8 from the War of 1812 buried here.

1. Start at **474 48TH AVE, LONG ISLAND CITY** going towards **48TH AVE** - go **0.2** mi
2. Turn **L** on **VERNON BLVD** - go **0.3** mi
3. Continue on **10TH ST** - go **0.2** mi
4. Turn **R** on **44TH AVE** - go **0.2** mi
5. Turn **L** on **21ST ST** - go **0.1** mi
6. Take ramp onto **59TH ST BRG** - go **1.4** mi
7. Take ramp onto **57TH ST** - go **1.9** mi
8. **57TH ST** becomes **RT-9A NORTH** - go **5.5** mi
9. Take exit **#14** towards **G W BRIDGE/NEW JERSEY/UPPER LEVEL** onto **I-95 SOUTH** - go **1.8** mi
10. Take exit **#74** onto **PALISADES INTERSTATE PKY NORTH** - go **13.6** mi
11. Take exit **#5N** towards **ORANGEBURG** - go **0.9** mi
12. Bear **L** on **ORANGEBURG RD** - go **0.3** mi
13. Turn **R** on **WESTERN HWY** - go **1.4** mi
14. Turn **L** on **COLONY DR** - go **0.2** mi
15. Arrive at the center of **10913**

Almost at the end of the rally, you're looking for two "CLAUSLAND"s. Someone said to me "I did a lot of looking for Santa, and I think there's only one CLAUSLAND out there". Right after you performed the "right at TL" there was a SUN sign on a telephone pole on the right just before a sharp turn to the left. After the curve on the left side were two signs for the **Clausland Cemetery**. Then the next intersection you cross over was Clausland Road, marked by a street sign. So there were three Clausland signs, but at the end of the road you are on is a forced bear right, the only bear right, so it was self correcting anyway.
